Beginning this Sunday, March 22, 2020, our Sunday worship as well as SIBLE will be altered to conform to the restrictions of the City of Plainfield regarding the limited number of people who may gather in any location. With such small numbers as 10 or less, only the Assistant Pastor, the morning preacher, Minister of Music, Media and a few officers will be in attendance. The church building will be closed to others. Our Worship Service will be streamed live on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am at <https://shilohplainfield.org/>.
