## **SBC LEADERSHIP TEAM RE-ENTRY FOR WORSHIP**

### **CONGREGANT PROTOCOLS**

Re-entry into the Shiloh Baptist Church for worship services with increased numbers for large gatherings is by design a slow process. While the Governor moves us into Phase II and beyond, gradually increasing the number of people allowed; your safety, health, and well-being are our primary concerns. As we, the people of God, re-enter the Sanctuary and engage in worship, there are a number of distinctive modifications required. We prayerfully ask that you observe all posted protocols and follow the directives of the trustees, ushers, and other guides.

### **Essential Protocols:**

- In order to maintain the appropriate numbers allowed, only those members pre-registered and/or confirmed are allowed into the Church for worship.
- Entrance and Exit to the church is at the Fifth Street door only.
- Please do not attend if you have been sick with COVID-19 or exposed to someone who has had the disease within the last 14 days.
- If you are currently showing symptoms including cough or shortness of breath, please stay home.
- Do not enter other areas of the church, other than the sanctuary or bathrooms, as other areas have been sanitized with “Do Not Enter Signs” on them.

Precautions for healthful and hopeful worship are as follows:

1. Permit temperatures to be taken upon entrance.
2. Sanitize and Sign in at the security area. (Each member 18 years of age or older)
3. Masks are to be worn at ALL times.
4. Remain six feet (6') apart at ALL times (Except for family households.)
5. Bathroom usage is maximum 2 -3 at a time.
6. Sanitize and wash hands after bathroom usage.
7. Enter the Sanctuary at the front only – 5<sup>th</sup> street side door.
8. Follow directives of the ushers for seating.
9. Refrain from congregating and fellowshiping after Service.
10. Clear the building as quickly as possible.

While, our worship experience is live streamed each Sunday, we desire the congregation to be present and engaged on-site during this “*Uncommon Season*”. At the same time, we endeavor to be responsible not only to God, but to you the “Body of Christ”.
